One of the things we'll be deciding on in 2025 will be whether to partner with School Choice Wisconsin (SCW) and participate in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP). This decision will be made at our Annual Voters' Meeting in May.

Since this past July, we've been meeting with Lutheran day school principals and pastors, School Choice Wisconsin leadership, and have hosted presentations which have been open to Immanuel members, visitors and parents whose children are enrolled in our day school.

The more we have heard and learned about the benefits of the School Choice voucher program, the more we have been encouraged to continue to provide opportunities for those who continue to have questions or who have yet to take advantage of getting the facts.

We will be inviting the School Choice Wisconsin leadership team back to Immanuel sometime this spring. Once we decide upon a date and time, we'll be encouraging folks to save the date. We will also be inviting the SCW leadership team to be present at our Annual Voters' Meeting in May. Doing so will provide one final opportunity to address any additional questions and concerns.

Throughout this process, nothing has changed as to where we as Immanuel's leadership – both pastoral, school, and laity – absolutely stand as to what is a non-negotiable if we should decide to move forward with the WPCP. That is absolutely nothing will change or be altered as to who we are and what our mission and ministry is – Reaching Out to All People, Teaching and Sharing God's Gift of Jesus.

Not a single sister day school within our North Wisconsin District which participates in the Wisconsin School Choice voucher program has said it has changed or altered their mission and ministry. In fact, our sister day schools have grown in their outreach and inclusion of families and students who seek to be part of a Christ-centered, Bible-based educational environment. Elsewhere in this newsletter, you'll find FAQ's regarding the WPCP. In each Rejoice! newsletter between now and our Annual Voters' Meeting in May you'll find additional FAQ's.

Know that any of our staff leaders and lay leaders are open to any questions or concerns you may have about this process or about the WPCP. If we don't have an answer, we will find the answer.

School Choice Frequently Asked Questions

Can a School Choice voucher school suspend or expel students that violate school policies and procedures?

Yes, state law requires schools participating in Wisconsin's school choice programs to have policies and procedures in place and published in handbooks that regulate suspensions and expulsions. The school's handbooks and written policies should be explicit as to student responsibilities, expectations, and causes for disciplinary action, including suspension and expulsion. Once a student is enrolled and accepted in the school, he or she is bound by school policies and procedures including suspension or expulsion. Parents and older students should sign a document stating that they have read the handbooks and policies, understand them, and will abide by them. This document forms a contract between the school and the parent/student. A school must supply parents with a copy of its handbooks, including the procedures the school has in place for imposition or appeal of suspensions or expulsions.

Note: Our sister School Choice voucher Lutheran day schools have emphasized the importance of being crystal clear in our handbooks and policies as to who we are and what is our mission and ministry. A student family which receives a voucher and chooses Immanuel day school must understand that everything we do and teach in all classes and activities (not only in religion classes) has at the core our Christ-centered, Bible-based confession and witness.
