My PM On Call shift at the Marshfield Medical Center on December 2nd was uneventful until I received a page to the ER. Three members of a family arrived as trauma patients resulting from a motor vehicle crash. As I greeted other family members who were not involved in the crash, I recognized one set of grandparents as Marcie and Jay, members of Immanuel. I then spent the next 3¹/₂ hours with them and other family members as they anxiously awaited for updates on their loved ones.

It turned out the mother involved in the crash is Marcie and Jay's daughter, Kamie, who is a graduate of Immanuel's Day School and the mother of 6-year-old Olivia ("Livy") and 17-month-old Jack, who were also involved in the crash. The most serious injuries were experienced by Jack, who spent 15 days in Marshfield's Pediatrics Intensive Care Unit (PICU) before being transferred to UW's PICU in Madison.

Here's what has been shared publicly about the details and results of what took place...

"At a county road intersection, a pickup truck, traveling at high speed and failing to yield to a stop sign, broadsided the driver's side of the family's vehicle, sending it flying onto its side and into the ditch.

"The tragedy following has been difficult to grasp. Sweet little Jack, having been on the driver's side and directly in the line of impact, has been in the ICU since that afternoon. The crash caused [skull fractures and his] brain to swell, affecting many other functions in his body. We are hearing good news, but the long-term effects for him are still unknown. "Kamie sustained major injuries as well, having a multitude of broken bones on the left side of her body. She will be undergoing months of therapy in order to regain the ability to walk. "Livy did suffer a fractured skull but is currently home and in good health - we are so grateful for this.

"Needless to say, the Pupols' family will be under tremendous financial stress from this tragedy - a fact they are grappling with as they sit next to their [infant] son daily in the ICU."

As the apostle Paul reminds us as the body of Christ, "If one member suffers, all suffer together..." (I Corinthians 12:26)

Singing with the Exiles

Gathered by the waters of Babylon, the exiles sadly wondered: "Is God for real? If so, does He really care about us? What does our future hold? Will this ever change?" God's people had watched their world shatter into a million pieces. They were demoralized and disillusioned. Their disaster looked terminal.

Do you feel this way? Does it look as though your current problems are more than you can bear? Do you find yourself asking: Why did this happen? Why did God allow it? Is there any order in the world? Will God really deliver on what He said?

God's prophet, Isaiah, answers these questions. He announces that just when Israel's history seemed closed and controlled by hopeless Babylonian policy, to the shock and surprise of everyone the Lord will stir up a king named Cyrus, and a new exodus will explode in the desert! A Servant will be wounded for our transgressions and crushed for our iniquities. And barren Zion will be given so many children that, like the old woman in the shoe, she won't know what to do! Standing behind these marvelous promises is God's almighty Word. "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever" (Isaiah 40:8). The exiles are going home!

That's why we beginning with Ash Wednesday, March 5th, and throughout Lent, Holy Week, and Resurrection Sunday, April 20th, we will be "Singing with the Exiles" as they are restored to their home.

Lent 2025, Isaiah 40–55 will shape us as we listen and take to heart these messages . . .

Ash Wednesday: "God Has a Word for That" (Isaiah 41:14–16) Lent 1: "He Only Has Eyes for You" (Isaiah 43:1–7) Lent 2: "Marked" (Isaiah 44:1–5) Lent 3: "Breaking Down the Gates" (Isaiah 45:1–8) Lent 4: "Get Out!" (Isaiah 48:17–22) Lent 5: "One Little Word Can Fell Him" (Isaiah 49:1–6) Holy Thursday: "He Prepares a Table" (Isaiah 49:7–13) Good Friday: "All" (Isaiah 52:13–53:12) Easter Vigil: "Nothing" (Isaiah 54:1–8) Easter Sunday: "We Are Going Home" (Isaiah 55:6–13)

Plan now to sing with the exiles as we learn from Isaiah to walk the Lenten way to the cross and to the empty tomb. God promises to turn our weeping into joy and our present pain into an endless Alleluia!

WISCONSIN SCHOOL CHOICE FAQ'S

How many parochial and private schools and students participate in a taxpayer funded parent choice\program in Wisconsin?

For the 2023–2024 school year, a total of 383 private schools enrolled nearly 55,000 students across the four existing parent choice programs in Wisconsin. Included in these schools are ten of the twelve North Wisconsin District day schools. Immanuel Marshfield's Day School is not currently enrolled.

Who is eligible for the Wisconsin program?

Eligibility is limited to families with income at or below 220 percent of the federal poverty level. That is about \$68,000 for a married family of four.

Must a student participate in religious activities?

No. A family may choose to opt their child out of religious activities. However, this rarely occurs because families choose schools in line with their values.

What happens if family income increases?

Once admitted, students may remain in the program regardless of changes in family income. A parent must still complete an annual application.

Are participating schools accountable?

Schools must provide the same hours of instruction as public schools and adhere to the same health and safety requirements as public schools. Teachers must either be licensed or have a bachelor's degree. Background checks for teachers are also required.

Do families value school choice?

Yes. The pandemic taught many families the importance of choosing a school in tune with their values. School Choice Wisconsin poll of likely voters conducted in February 2022 showed that 65 percent of Wisconsinites favor school choice for all families. Notably, support has increased among Independents and Democrats.

Don't delay in getting the facts of the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program! To learn more, go to schoolchoicewi.org. A decision will be made during the May 2025 Voters' Assembly as to Immanuel Lutheran Day School's participation beginning with the 2026-2027 school year.
